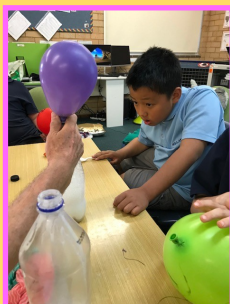
Making sense of the

writing, art, visiting the farm to see the steer, riding and eating birthday cake!!



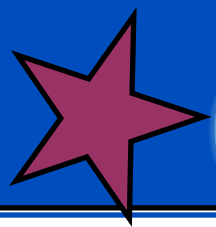

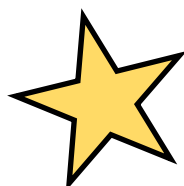

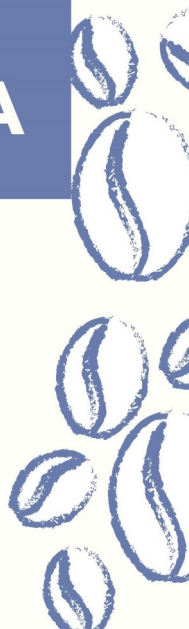
