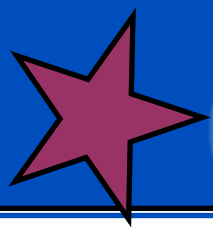
This week we were thrilled to hear that Sarah and Joshua Obst welcomed a daughter- Ellenora May. Congratulations to the new family.

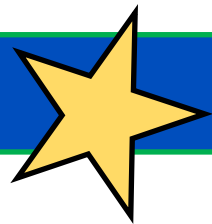

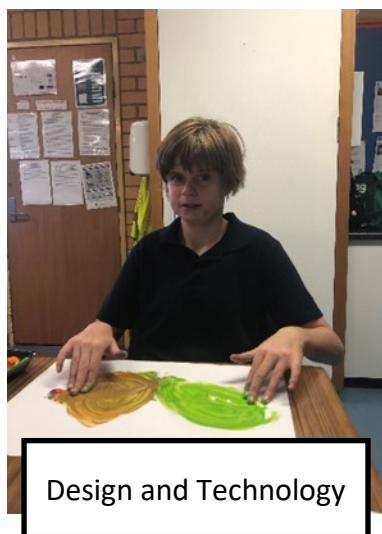
